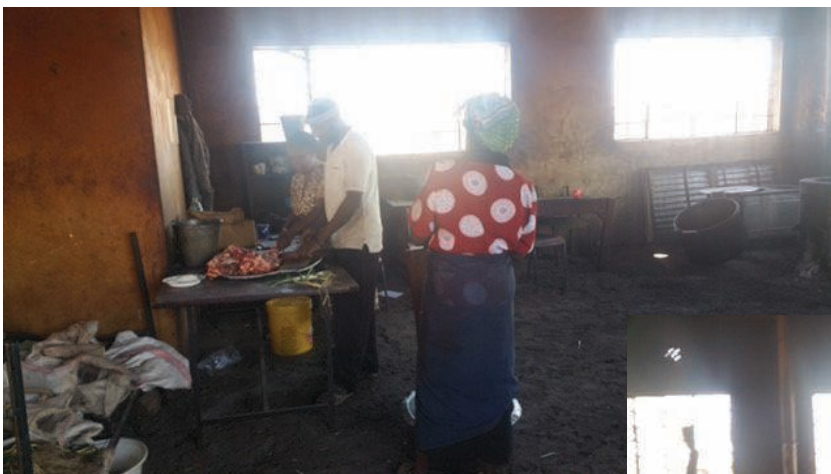


Dear Friends,

Did You Know ?

Ordinary Time



Ordinary Time celebrates the words and deeds of *Jesus* as he proclaims the Kingdom of God to the people of Israel, and through them, to the world.

Ordinary Time is a split season, it begins at the end of the **Christmas** season after the Baptism of the Lord. *Jesus* was baptized in the Jordan River by his cousin John. *Jesus* was revealed as the Son of God. This is when *Jesus* accepted and began his mission. *Jesus* knew he would have to suffer and die to save all of God's people from sin.

This season of **Ordinary Time** concludes on the Tuesday before **Ash Wednesday**.

Ordinary Time begins again on the Monday after **Pentecost** (late May or early June) and concludes with the Solemnity of *Jesus Christ*, King of the Universe.

This season of **Ordinary Time** lasts much longer than the first one. It is mostly during the summer and fall. It is the growing season, when the fields and orchards and gardens produce grain and fruit and vegetables. We ask the *Holy Spirit* to help the word of God grow in our hearts and bear good fruit. We want to grow in faith, hope and love.
