

On July 27th, our group of thirteen loaded up the vehicles to head out to Alexandria Bay on a dreary rainy morning. By the time we drove into Alex Bay, the sun was out and we never saw a cloud the rest of the weekend! God is Good! In Alex Bay, our group took the boat ride to Boldt Castle and really enjoyed touring this amazing structure. We watched the movie and learned all about George Boldt and his love for his wife Louise. The Castle renovations were spectacular and we all had a great time. We ventured next to Wellesley Island to the home of Rich and Linda Guile, who graciously let the 13 of us descend on their lovely home. The teens had a ball in the St. Lawrence river, it was cold but they didn't seem to mind at all. We had dinner, played cards and enjoyed the most glorious sunset over the trees on the Canadian side. God is God...all the time!

We headed out early in the morning, crossed the border and made it to Oshawa, Ontario in great time. We were the first group to sign in at the registration table at the Campus of University of Ontario Institute of Technology where the Franciscan Steubenville Conference was being held. It was a beautiful campus, we felt like we were at a hotel, our rooms were amazing. The excitement entering the Conference Center for the opening session was just electric! Josh Blakesley and Sarah Kroger were playing with the band and the Christian Rock music was on fire! Both of these artists are amazing musicians and they led us in Praise and Worship for the 3 days we were together. Dur keynote speaker was Chris Padgett, who commanded our attention through his humor, wit and great evangelization! He was perfect for the 2000 teens that were there to experience the Franciscan retreat focused on "Elevate" from Rev. 21:5 and we were elevated! Over the three days our group experienced workshops on various topics: separate workshops for boys and girls, Social Media Workshop, How to Pray, Temptations that lead to Addiction, to name a few. Fr. Rick Martignetti lead the 2000 teens in Adoration both Friday night and Saturday night. To say it was "powerful" is an understatement. We were touched in a way that can't be described, we were caught up in the Spirit and it was so emotional! We loved Adoration, the music, the Praise, the incense, the Procession, Jesus with us! Reconciliation was offered all weekend and our teens all lined up to be made clean, to begin again with a fresh slate and we loved the feeling. There were 20 priests scattered in a beautiful quad on campus sitting among the trees and landscaping – it was there face to face that we felt so at ease and really embraced the healing of the Sacrament. Again, God is good!

We had Mass Saturday morning with the Bishop and on Sunday, we had our closing Liturgy with 30 priests and Cardinal Thomas Christopher Collins from Canada. To have Mass with a Cardinal was so incredible and his homily was just perfect for the group of young people. We talked a lot on the way home about his homily and could remember all the points he spoke on – pretty incredible for the end of three intense days!

As we left Canada, yes we were tired, but we were filled with the call of the Spirit to go out and make a difference in the world. Would we go again next year, was the question and of course, we all said "yes"! Now it's our job to invite more, to inspire more and to move more teens to join us on this amazing weekend of transformation.




