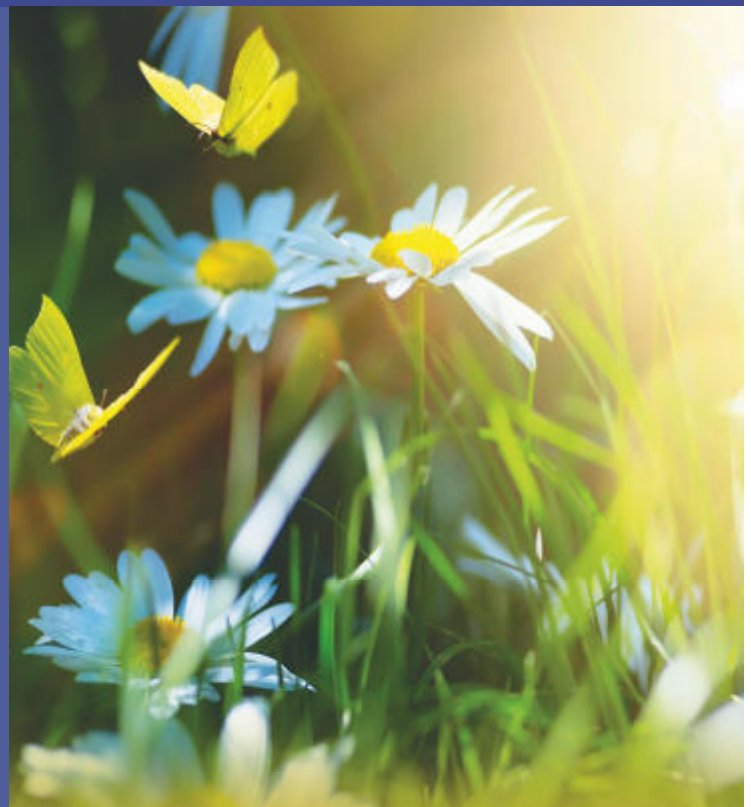

Parish Registration: Welcome to all new families and individuals. Please register as soon as possible. Registration forms and a welcome packet are available in the church office

Membership is a condition for the reception of the sacraments of baptism, reconciliation, first Eucharist, confirmation and marriage.

Registration is also required before the parish can issue a sponsorship certificate for those asked to be sacramental sponsors. You must be a registered, contributing member for at least three months before a certificate is provided.
