

Wednesday: Ten Kinds of People We Don't Have to Love

How the Mission works

Father Collins appeals to people's experience, both negative (How come prayer doesn't work?) and positive (in yearning to do good, we are uncovering the grace of God within.) He helps individuals explore key questions, such as: How do I identify God in the events of my life? How do I share my faith with others? How can I be more loving?

These topics are discussed with humor and honesty. Because Father Collins is in touch with the realities of people's lives, he helps them find God in the ordinary and everyday. Through the mission, people soon discover that they are not so far from God after all.




