# Respect Life

American Life League recently published an analysis of the American Nurses Association that should concern every American. It seems that the long-standing ANA position against assisted suicide is now under review. Nancy Valko, RN, reports: "Not only is the ANA attempting to change its previously used term assisted suicide to 'aid in dying' ( the approved term of Compassion and Choices), but also the Code of Ethics itself."

The nursing profession will be dealt a tragic blow if this recommendation becomes part of the ANA code of ethics moving forward. It will mean that nurses, once thought to be nurturers and caregivers, will be, instead, medical professionals seeking ways to help their patients die. An emergency text was sent out to all the members and a awesome group of girls answered yes! The Farm staff were amazed by what was accomplished, the weather held out and there was even a cool breeze to keep everyone comfortable.

A special thanks to Peg Dwyer and Keith Condon who volunteered to drive our team and help chaperone. They also put in two hours of hard work.

This is the first of many trips to Lafayette and Vesper that YIM will make this summer. Our members love going there and the best is when we return to pick all the produce that came from one seed or one tiny planting. Let's pray for good sunshine, gentle rains and many volunteers to help those who can't afford fresh expensive produce.
