Next weekend August 10th and 11th our linked parishes will be welcoming Fr. Innocent Ejike Onyenagubo from the Ahiara Dioceses of Nigeria. Fr. Innocent currently works as a chaplain at Upstate University Hospital and Hutchings Mental Health Center.

Ahiara Diocese: is one of the most rural dioceses in Nigeria. It is one of the Southern poorest areas of the nation. There the government does not help to provide the people with daily necessities of life and the people have nobody to speak for them except the Bishops and priest.

In this area, there is **no good food provisions, no good water, no electricity. No hospitals and no health care provisions of any kind.** Many people die in this community every day due to preventable and curable diseases.

Nigeria: a Super power in Africa with a population of 200,000,000 people is seen today as the most dangerous and most corrupt nation of the world. There is a great divide in Nigeria between the North and South. The Northern Muslims have controlled the political power of the nation for many years. The Southern Christian Communities have suffered greatly from the Muslim leadership of Nigeria since her independence in 1960.

A major victory was won for the Dr. James Dobson Family Institute and its "Family Talk" radio show. A federal court recently issued an order permanently preventing the government from enforcing the HHS abortion-pill mandate against the ministry.
